- **How safe is CIU?**

- **Is there student employment on campus?**

Yes. All student employment positions are posted online at www.my.ciu.edu (link is external) and on the bulletin board in the Administration Building near Human Resources.

- **What are on-campus living requirements?**

All single Undergraduate students under 23 are required to live on campus. Undergraduate students living with family within commuting distance (50 miles) must live on campus their first two semesters at CIU. Students may move off campus if they will turn 23 during that semester. Seniors and those who are 22 may petition to live in the on-campus apartments. - **What is the Federal Work-Study?**

The Federal Work-Study (FWS) Program provides funds for part-time jobs which allow students to earn money needed to pay for educational expenses. Work-Study awards are a form of federal financial aid. Students are encouraged to find positions that provide work experience in their field of study or provide valuable service to the community.

- **What is the male to female ratio?**

Undergraduate: 47% male students and 53% female students. Graduate and Seminary: 56% male students and 44% female students.

- **What On Campus Organizations are there at CIU?**

The Student Senate is the executive cabinet responsible for representing the students before the administration and communicating back to the students. The presidents of all student organizations serve on the Senate with the four student senate executive officers. On Campus organizations include; The Student Union, Student Mission Connection, The Final, Married Student Association, African American Student Association, Grad Life Council, Mu Kappa, The Exchange, International Students Ministries, The Credo, Freshmen Leadership Team, Class Officers and Pilgrims Protest.

- **What special needs and disabilities services does CIU offer?**

Under the ADA requirements, disability accommodations are provided on an individualized basis and can include test adjustments, printed media reformatted to audio, course substitution, readers, tutors, note-takers, study groups, proctored testing etc. CLEP testing and proctoring missed and distance course exams are additional services provided through Academic Services.

- **What sports programs does CIU have?**

We are excited about our new intercollegiate sports program! We currently compete in the following sports: men's soccer, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's basketball.
